The Department of Health and Human Services' (HHS) Administration for Children and Families (ACF) is currently soliciting applications for its Basic Center Program, which makes funds available to provide an alternative for runaway and homeless youth who might otherwise end up with law enforcement or in the child welfare, mental health, or juvenile justice systems. Each BCP must provide runaway and homeless youth with a safe and appropriate shelter, individual, family, and group counseling as appropriate and aftercare. This program will consist of \$15,798,302 distributed among 120 awards.

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### - Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health for Communities -

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is currently soliciting applications for its Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health for Communities (REACH) Program, which supports local communities to strategically organize to implement and evaluate evidence-based policy, system, and environmental change interventions that eliminate racial and ethnic health disparities in chronic diseases. This program will consist of \$4,000,000 distributed among 10 awards.

The program 1) allows a phased project period with key outcomes for each phase, 2) engages populations typically left out of the policy, systems, and environmental processes, thereby not realizing the full benefit of such public health actions, and 3) will close the gap in the impact of policy, systems, and environmental change interventions in communities of color.

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#### - Community Planning Challenge Grant & DOT TIGER II FY2010 Pre-Notice -

The Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and the Department of Transportation (DOT) are jointly currently soliciting pre-applications for the Community Planning Challenge Grant and the TIGER II FY2010 grants respectively. HUD and DOT expect that some projects will incorporate features of both programs which is why this is a combined grant. This is only the pre-notice at the moment which is due before the regular application round for these grants.

HUD's Community Planning Challenge Grant will foster reform and reduce barriers to achieving affordable, economically vital, and sustainable communities. This program will consist of \$40,000,000 distributed among an unknown number of awards.

DOT's TIGER II FY2010 Grant is designed to fund the planning, preparation, or design of surface transportation projects that would be eligible for funding under the TIGER II Discretionary Grant program. Examples include highway or bridge projects, public transportation projects, passenger and freight rail transportation projects, and port infrastructure projects. This program will consist of \$35,000,000 distributed among an unknown number of awards.
